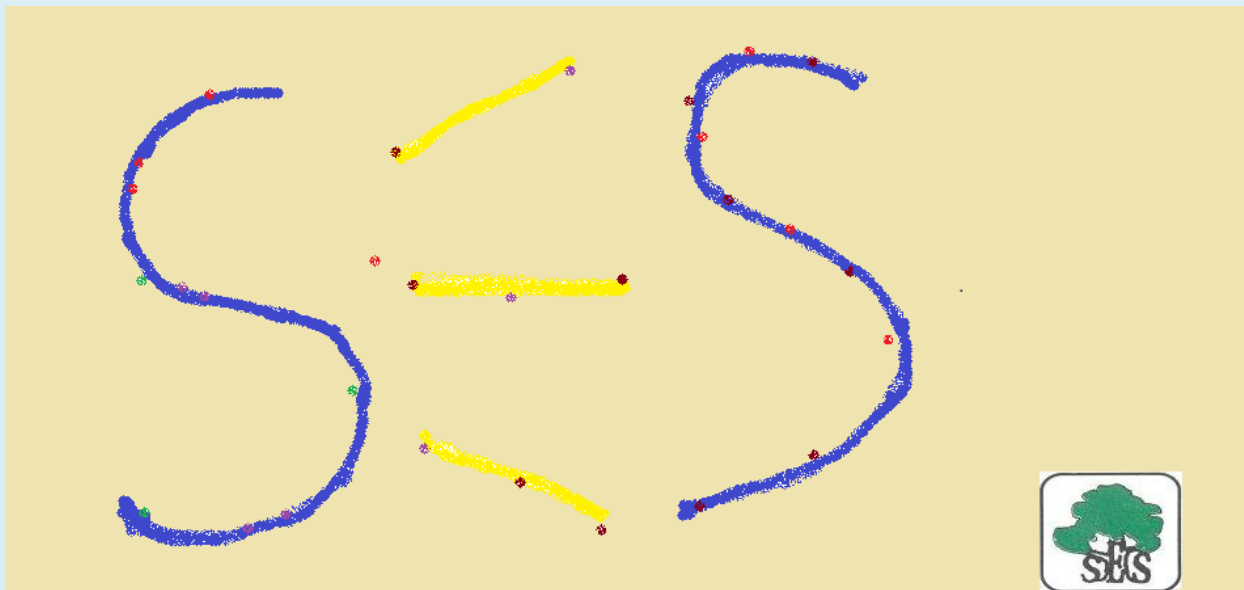

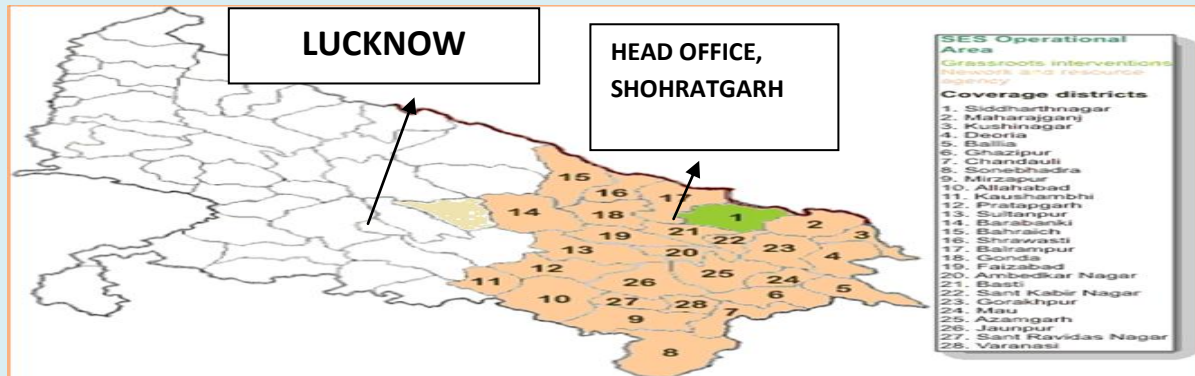

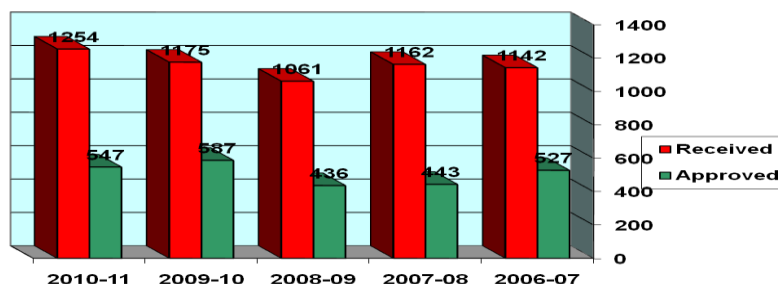

ABOUT SES

From Ancient times, teachers and students have shared special bonds. There was a time when students' upbringing was done under guidance of guruji. In 1985, teachers and students (of Shivpati Post Graduate College) once again came together. This time for a social cause. Local act of safe drinking water gave birth to Shohratgarh Environmental Society (SES). It was started as a voluntary organization but passion & hard work of their founders gave it recognition. SES has been registered as society under *Society Registration XXI (1860)*. In all those years SES has worked at root level in villages. While working our workers have developed rapport with general communities, people of villages & others. They call the organization "Paryavaran Samiti" (Environmental Society) Calling it paravaran samiti by people shows its universal appeal & acceptance of common people. Though by name it looks that our organization works only for area concern with environmental issues but that is not true. As an organization SES knows its responsibility towards society & worked in different arena of social sector. It is sustainable agriculture, health, disaster management, livelihood, education, empowerment of women. SES helped people to raise their voice in form of advocacy. In last 24 years, Karmbhoomi (Operational area) of society is Uttar Pradesh. As a democratic organization, SES has always emphasized on approach of people participation whether it was issue of women empowerment or livelihood. There were people who fall under poor, deprived & marginalized section of society. SES has undertaken development initiatives and help those people to come out of poverty, earn their livelihood.

"TOWARDS ENVIRONMENT CONSERVATION" NATIONAL ENVIRONMENT AWARENESS CAMPAIGN

The programme named National Environment Awareness Campaign (NEAC) is supported by Ministry of Environment & Forests, Government of India. The objective is to create awareness among common people of 29 districts of Eastern U.P. regarding current situation of environment & to focus their role for conservation & environment. SES is nominated as Regional Resource Agency (RRA) to conduct National Environment Awareness Programme in 29 districts of Eastern part of U.P. from last 15 years.



In year 2010-11, theme of the programme was "Biodiversity conservation". Total 547 applications were accepted in which there are 434 NGOs & 113 Schools. Representative from Different sectors involved in activities from bottom to Top like – Gram Pradhan, Teachers, Principals, Lawyers, Doctors, Govt. officers like DM, CDO, DFO, Ag.O, BDO, MLA & MPs etc. People from all sectors (Children, Men & Women) involved in campaign. This programme covers population of 1 lakh (approximately). The organization has pool of monitors who monitor programme by various organization. Organization also organizes pre & post programme workshop. In first, participants were get aware about NEAC & in second one, selected organization get capacity building training & discuss about their future plans. This year workshop were held at Allahabad, Gorakhpur, Lucknow & Siddharthnagar.

PARYAVARN MITRA

The Paryavaran Mitra Programme (PM) is an initiative of CEE in partnership with the Ministry of Environment and Forests (MoEF) and ArcelorMittal. The Paryavaran Mitra project aims to guide, facilitate, capacity build students through curriculum-linked activities and co-curricular action projects to take positive environmental action to impact at individual, community, national and global level. The *Paryavaran Mitra* project seeks to reach students in classes from standards 6 – 9 (age group 11-15). The first phase of the programme is for a period of three years from 2010-2013. The programme plans to reach out to 2, 00,000 schools and 2 crore school students across the country will be reached in this phase. These students will be from schools in every state and every district of India. SES is implementing in schools of Basti (100), Gorakhpur (50), Mahrajganj(100) & Siddharthnagar(100). **Objectives of Paryavaran Mitra Programme** -Students will be made aware, sensitized and helped to understand the underlying science, social issues and the ethical issues relating to sustainability and climate change. Students should be able to gain knowledge and skills through hands on experience and projects about their immediate environment; their school, neighbourhood, village or city and national and international issues relating to sustainability and climate change. Of these activities at least one has to be carried out in the student's family or community. Every school must also celebrate at least one Environmental Day. Students should be motivated through involvement in action projects related to sustainability and climate change to become agents of change. To encourage, guide, train and facilitate students to become Paryavaran Mitras. The programme activities include school enrollment, teacher-principle orientation workshop, activities at school level with distribution of IEC materials. The activities quite interesting & enhance the interest of students in all 5 basic themes: Water, Waste Management, Energy, Biodiversity, Culture and Heritage. Based on the learnings from the held workshop, ensure that the teachers have carried out various Paryavaran Mitra activities with school children in their respective schools during the implementation period and help teachers in planning, scheduling and implementing Paryavaran Mitra activities in schools. A detail report has been submitted to you. Person responsible for the programme monitor the programme regularly. The programme is a step towards SES thinking that future lies in the hand of young generation.

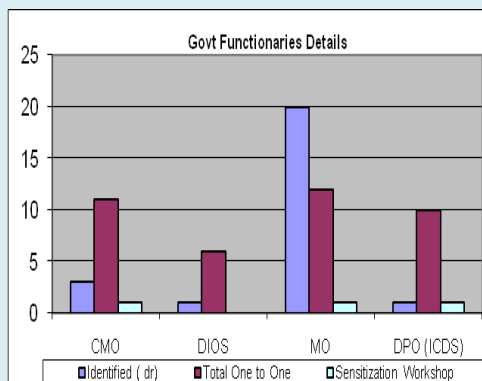

PREVENTION OF EARLY MARRIAGE & PREGNANCY

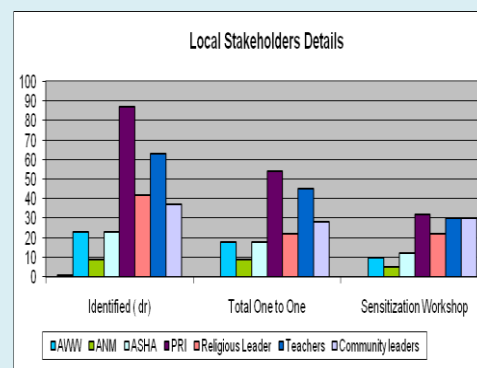
- ✓ SES has been implemented the project “Improving the reproductive and sexual Health of Young People by Increasing Age at Marriage” with the support of MAMTA, New Delhi & funded by European Commission from March 2009 in (JOGIA BLOCK)Siddharth Nagar. District Siddharthnagar is one of backward district of UP comes under TARAI region.Activities under project are:
- ✓ Advocacy with people representatives, **policy makers and govt. functionaries, one-to-one interaction with functionaries at district**
- ✓ District advocacy workshops with key stakeholders, religious leaders
- ✓ Teachers orientation on life skill based srh education at district level
- ✓ One to one interaction with the key community stake holders (pris, vhc members, priest. kazi, teacher, basic health workers, parents, in-laws),Issues based awareness building meetings with young people,Training of peer educators
- ✓ Formation of youth groups, establishment of youth information center, sensitizing community and mass awareness, wall writing, chetna abhiyan
- ✓ One to one interaction with the ngo/cbos /groups,Orientation workshop with local agencies, one day media sensitization meeting.Regular basis participation of staff in the meeting of inters department committees at block / district level for the addressing of project issues through advocacy.
- ✓ CMO taken initiatives for the formation and activation of vhsch under NRHM at gp level.

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

- ✚ 30 couple has delayed first pregnancy through use of contraceptive after counseling and motivation. 12 gauna delayed.
- ✚ 13 girls are taking training of Silai at Jogia , after parent meeting
- ✚ Two days Awareness campaigning was completed on Child Rights with collaboration of BACHPAN BACHAO ANDOLAN.
- ✚ 8 out of school girls from the intervention area are taking life skill education training NRHM in Jai Kisan Inter College, Sanai.
- ✚ Marriage registration has started in 8 GP with support of VHSC and BAL VIVAH NIRODHAK SAMITI.
- ✚ 35 drop out children is identified for enrollment in school in July. Parent agreed for education.
- ✚ 22 drop out Children are enrolled in School in July & August.
- ✚ Youth Welfare Officer wished to take cooperation from us in establishing sports field at our intervention area for the youth.
- ✚ 20 service providers and stakeholders of block and district level were sensitized on the project issues.
- ✚ 24 parents group is formed and functional and 120 adult peer educators have been identified. 12 YIC managers from 53 peer educators, were trained on life skill education and SRH issues, maintenance YIC and their records, logistic They are organizing the meeting of youth in their YICs. 36 groups of youth was formed with support of trained peer educators.
- ✚ 13 girls are taking training of Silai at Jogia , after parent meeting
- ✚ 45 students are registered for vocational training.
- ✚ Two days Awareness campaigning was completed on Child Rights with collaboration of BACHPAN BACHAO ANDOLAN.
- ✚ 5 Kasturba Schools 14th out of school girls from the intervention area are taking life skill education training.

ADOLESCENT FRIENDLY HEALTH SERVICES (AFHS)

MAMTA with Macarthur Foundation has started working on 'legal age' at marriage for boys and girls delaying subsequent pregnancy while enhancing sexual reproductive health of youth (10-24) in India. It has included- prevention of early marriage and early pregnancy, LSE & AFHS. SES has opted for working on adolescent friendly health services IN Jogia block Of district Siddharthnagar. The activity done was:

- ✿ Monthly interaction with district authorities (DPM, DC, CMHO, DHS) for inclusion of AFHS in district health plan.
- ✿ Interaction with block authorities (BPM, SDM, BLOCK CMHO, MO-CHC) for inclusion off AFHS in block level health plan.
- ✿ Advocacy with panchayat to send recommendation to block/district authorities (Health For inclusion of AFHS in district health plan.
- ✿ Signature campaign with young people/youth groups to inspire government authorities to take action on demand of young people (AFHS)
- ✿ Submission of memorandum to DC, DHS, by youth forums for roll out of AFHS.
- ✿ Celebration of theme days (NYD, IYD, NGCD)
- ✿ Advocacy with VHSC for roll out of AFHS.

The achievements of AFHS in year 2010-11 were:

- ✓ Significant reduction in stigma in the community and young people regarding reproductive and sexual health problems.
- ✓ With signature campaign (of 200 youths), youth appealed government functionaries to bring AFHS in district health plan. Still it is to advocated to be in PIP.

SURESTART- FOR HEALTHY MOTHER & CHILD

According to National Family Health survey-III, only 21% of deliveries are institutional, only 42 % of children had received 3 or more ANC. In year 2007, SES with support of PATH, CRS & PGSS has started working on mother & infant issue. SES has opted three block of Gorakhpur: Campierganj, Sajhanwa & Khajani for Sure Start project. The overall goal of the project was “Sustainably enhanced maternal & newborn health status through effective community action. So, objective were divided as:

OBJECTIVE 1: *to significantly increase, individual, household and community action that directly and indirectly improves maternal & newborn health.*

OBJECTIVE 2: *To enhance systems & institutional capabilities for sustained improvement in maternal and newborn care & health status.*

The activities were targeted in three levels:

- a) Awareness & advocacy activities which focus on mass media programme and advocacy at district & block level.
- b) Community mobilization activities has done with PRIs, SHGs and other community groups in the target area.
- c) This level had household activities which include women, mothers of new born , family members including spouse and mothers in law, birth attendant.

Few of activities done are mentioned:

- ❖ Registrations of pregnant women at aganwadi centres and facilitate reach of supplementary nutrition to pregnant women.
- ❖ Comprehensive antenatal care including weight monitoring by AWW & ANM.
- ❖ Ensured safe deliveries by skilled birth attendants including strengthening recognition of danger signs.
- ❖ Facilitated at least 3 post natal visits by ANM ON DAY 1,7 & 28 of delivery birth by ASHA.
- ❖ Skill building of ASHA & TBA through meeting & trainings.
- ❖ Facilitated coordination, cooperation between government and front line health service providers.
- ❖ Community mobilization/participation in home based care.
- ❖ Also celebrated various days related to health such as safe motherhood day, VHND etc.

The achievements of sure start are:

- Participation in NRHM planning, district & block level health committee. Project staff has provided their feedback on MIH issues which help in improvement of health status.
- Advocacy with PRI/VHSC was done in all targeted GPs and does support roll out of Janani Suraksha Yojana & prizes for highest performing panchayat.
- For registration of birth & death, community system was developed in all GPs.
- MG& VHSC actively working on MIH after activation & orientation.
- Adaptation are of good practices or change of behavior regarding MIH issues at house hold level during counseling, home visit & follow up.

The achievement below is for block Khajanai, Sahjanwa & Campierganj respectively:-

- Institutional deliveries- 62.35%, 83.14%, 66.29%
- Institutional deliveries accompanied by ASHA- 88.75%, 76.68% & 90.11 %
- % value of live births- 95.25 %, 94.72 & 95.63 %.

PROJECT

Hepatitis B & C is at least 10 times dangerous than of HIV. While awareness and funding about them are lagging far behind that of aids. ses with support of hope initiatives has working on awareness in district Siddharthnagar & Gorakhpur. The programme is supported by SPPGI, Lucknow. While awareness and funding about them are lagging far behind that of AIDS.SES with support of hope initiatives has working district Siddharthnagar for awareness. The title of project is : “ B-rodh project : hepatitis awareness programme in schools of district Siddharthnagar & Gorakhpur.” As it is always consider that children are future of a country & they can mould in early stage in comparison of adults. Total 44 & 51 activities has been performed in schools of district Gorakhpur & Siddharthnagar respectively. The issues covered in the programme were: - Hepatitis, Encephalitis, Traffic rule, Climate change, Hygiene & sanitation. Tools used in the programme were farr show, flip show, lecture & discussion & flex presentation. As far as result concern , students & teachers were sensitized regarding issues which were ignorant earlier.

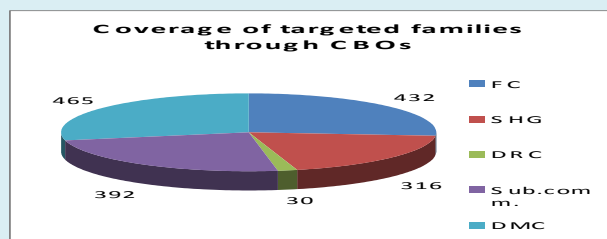
TOWARDS SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE

MANAGING LIVELIHOOD IN FLOOD PRONE AREA

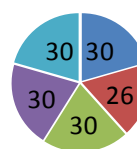
Villages of Campierganj region falls in Terai region of Himalaya and is affected by regular floods from Nepal through river & streams. About 80-85 percent of the populations are dependent on agriculture & agriculture related activities. Around 60 %of population has land, though most of them are small and fragmented. Off farm activities in this area are livestock, rearing, shared cropping & agricultural laborer. Flood affect their activities at large extent. With Support of CRS India, SES is implementing activities. The goal of project is to empower Communities to ensure food Security, health, education & livelihood needs through combined efforts. Activities include –agri,cultural CBOs Meeting, regular strengthening meeting of DMC, regular meeting of SHG and linkages with banks for support to income generation activities, linkages with Govt. department specially revenue, agriculture, veterinary deptt, Panchayat etc , Farmer Club Meeting, Grain Bank Status, Seed Bank Status, SHGs Detail, Farmer Field School .For Instance income generation activity Income Generation activities in SHGs are-

- + Goat keeping
- + Buffaloes keeping
- + Vegetable production
- + Small shop ownership

05 Farmers and 05 Project staff participated in Kishan Vigyan Kendra, Berpeta, Assam (KVK) on dated 13 to 20 February 2011. During this Exposure visit they aware about poultry farms, pig keeping, mustard Cropping, mushroom production, fish Keeping, bee keeping, bamboo craft .(See the picture below) . The programme also linked with government schemes like National Food Security Mission, National Horticulture Mission,,Agriculture Technology Management Agency (ATMA) which helped farmers in best possible way.

In December 2010, students of Agri Business Management Programme, IIM Lucknow conducted the a field research visit to various villages in Campearganj Block of Gorakhpur district with the objective to to study the effectiveness of the various initiatives launched by NGOs, government schemes, SHGs etc. especially that of our [SES]SRI,SWI, intensification (SRI) and analyze and study the various factors those cause/hinder the development of villagers especially farmers, study the brand preference in the various product categories of the rural buyer.

SYSTEM OF INTENSIFIED FARMING

Rice is life for millions of people in the world, particularly in developing country like India. In target region the production is affected by flood & yield. SES has adopted the System of Rice Intensification (**SRI**) is a method of increasing the yield of rice produced in farming. It requires less input of seed, water etc. In SRI paddy cultivation less seed (2kg/acre) is required and fewer plants per unit area (25x25cm) where as in general Paddy cultivation 20kg seed is required per acre. SRI technique low expenditure on fertilizer and plant protection chemicals. In the year 2009-10 SRI technique has been successfully experimented with 155 farmers in 50 acres of land. After its adoption farmers found that Production is 1.5 times more than that of traditional cropping of paddy.

ACHIEVEMENTS

- ♣ People have adopted SRI & SWI and there is significant increase in their income.
- ♣ Supported in installation of hand pump in Azigraha, Mushabar, Mirihirya.
- ♣ Supported 8 farmers for mini kit in village Babholiya..
- ♣ Supported panchayat member of Pathanpurwa and get constructed drainage.
- ♣ Committee supported village Chakdaha & Bhujoli & get constructed roads under MNREGA. Also supported in construction of road in Bandoh.
- ♣ Supported panchayat member of gopalpur to get 300 meter road under MNREGA.



After observing the grand success of SRI method in Rice, SES has tried **SWI** in Wheat with resource poor farmers of block Caimpearganj in district Gorakhpur, U.P. Generally farmers has land about 0.5 acre. This method has been done with 75 farmers in 14 villages during rabi season of 2010-2011.

TOWARDS SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE

The **Diversified Agricultural Support Project(DASP)** is initiated by Govt. of UP and in its effort ,SES is assisting them in district Siddharthnagar. Focus of programme is to accelerate diversified agricultural growth in the tarai region. The project aims on delivery of agricultural services to t market-led opportunities for growth which improves living standard of local people along with environment conservation. It also supports the expansion and rehabilitation of rural infrastructure and strengthen Panchayat Raj institutions, NGOs, and beneficiary participation for devolution of responsibility for sustainable management of rural assets.In the year ,260 NADEP pits prepared in the year,20 demonstration of tomato ,12 of capsicum colored, 44 of cauliflower ,100 of cowpea,10 farmers for individual nursery growing,3 farmers for mushroom production & 2 for be production for beekeeping etc.

Organisation is also supporting **National Horticulture Mission** in Mahrajanj district of Uttar Pradesh. The programme is launched as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme to promote holistic growth of the horticulture sector through an area based regionally differentiated strategies. The scheme is fully funded by the Government and different components proposed for implementation financially supported on the scales laid down.

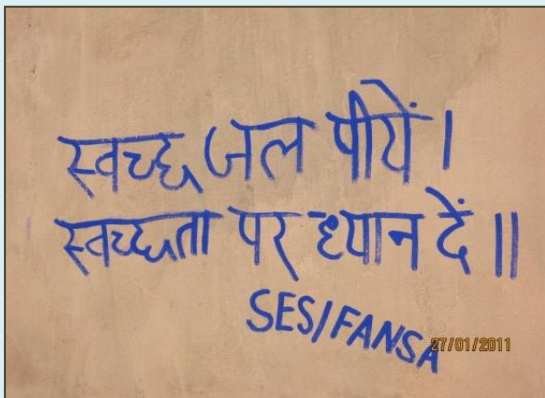
(HELPING ORPHANS BY PROVIDING EDUCATION & EMPOWERMENT)

Hope is initiated by SES which focus on empowering orphan by providing education With support of community worldwide. An orphanage is run by Sri Chandresh Shastri in Uska bazaar block of district siddharthnagar (uttar pradesh).During visit , Senior members Of official found that school needs cooking equipments & utensils, bed sheets, bed, clothes,uniform (include washing), study materials, copy etc. SES has selected this orphanage for its first phase of HOPE programme. On priority basis, team has found that Bed is inevitable .With support of its NGO partners, SES has raised fund for bed.

WATER WATER EVERYWHERE???

CAMPAIGN & SURVEY RIGHT TO SAFE DRINKING WATER & SANITATION

While on Earth, 1.1 billion people have no access to safe drinking water and two million children die every year for want of clean water and sanitation facilities. If depletion of fresh water continues at the current pace, It is believed that the next world war would not be for land, nor for oil, but for water. Still, we steadily pollute waters around us, we damage this planet. The sure 'slow kill' of most pollutants often goes unnoticed, unlike an oil tanker disaster where the destruction of coastal and marine life can be photographed for the World's front pages. We at SES are still an optimist. There's an old saying that 'optimists tend to make things happen whilst pessimists tend to allow things to happen'. For things to get better, we need to believe they will and we need to design and implement the best way forward for balanced progress and for our survival." Water Initiative by FANSA (UP) is part of it. With support of FANSA a campaign and survey has done in Siddharthnagar district. Ten villages were selected as activity area in block of Shohratgarh & Jogia . The activities perform in these villages were:

- Survey of 50 families
- With support of volunteer & staff, campaign was held to sensitize community regarding water.
- Slogan & handbills were used to create awareness among communities.
- To get suggestion & feedback from Panchayat.

STORIES OF SUCCESS

Village Bhargai is situated on bank of river Rapti. It is 22 kilo meter away from block campierganj. Shivpujan is resident of bhargai. 6 is number of members of his family. He has 3 bigha agricultural land. His source of livelihood is: agriculture & labour work. Shohratgarh Environmental Society is working on food security, livelihood enhancement of community & their linkage with government schemes. In farmer's club meeting, farmers were told about system of wheat intensification (S.W.I) in detail. It inspired Shivpujan to implement SWI in his 10 decimal lands. He has adopted organic method. He has obtained 1 quintal 26 Kilogram paddy by using S.W.I. He said that he required less input but production is just double. He is very enthusiastic and determined to implement S.W.I. method in all his agricultural land. He said "It will certainly ensure our food security." He & his family is very happy & thankful to Shohratgarh Environmental Society.

There is a village Sirsiya in a block Jogiya. It's situated 12 Km north from district head quarter Siddharthnagar. It is mixed populated village. Most of them Bhrahman, Pasi & Lodh- all of are very traditional and orthodox. Community is living with so many social evils and myths. Child marriage is one of them. The story is of young rebellious girl 'Soni'. Her father Mr. Vedo Vyas Pandey is living in this village with his four children (two sons & two daughters). First two elders are married. Elder brother living his separate life from his father. Mr. Pandey living with Soni 15th years and her elder brother Manish 17th years. Now Soni is an adolescent girls and her sister is only 10 years old. **Due to the custom** of the village Soni is in eligible for marriage. In meantime, his neighbor girl elopes with someone at the age of 15th years. The community of Mr. Pandey has pressurized to marry his daughter Soni. In this pressure poor Mr. Pandey finalized his mother less daughter Soni's marriage. During the vulnerable youth group meeting, our ORW of SES ,Smt. Priyanka Pandey has got information about this marriage. She approached her father Mr. Pandey and elder brother Manish with Mr. Sudhakar Pratap Singh, Supervisor of EMEP. She tried to convince them and tell her about consequence of child marriage. Yet, they were not ready to delay her marriage. Priyanka Pandey has spoken to Soni and asked her to talk to her being groom. Bold Soni has just taken a forward step. She talked to her to be groom. She convinced her groom to delay for second marriage (gauna). She wanted to be a independent before gouna. Now, she is attending sewing, embroidering classes at Naugarh. Her gauna is delayed for two years till then she will be establish herself as a ladies tailor. Now she is happy with delaying her Gouna.
